The Ball State University Digital Policy Institute (DPI) announces a student paper competition open to all Ball State undergraduate, graduate students, and recent graduates. DPI is seeking student work that addresses issues in the area of digital policy. DPI will publish selected papers on its website under its "Issues in Digital Policy" series.

Papers may be submitted in one of three categories: Business, Policy or Technology. Papers that cover more than one of these categories are encouraged, but for judging purposes students must designate the entry in a specific area.

Papers may be work students used as previous coursework or published elsewhere. There is no minimum length for submissions but papers may not exceed 10,000 words.

Winning papers in each category will receive a plaque and free registration to the Digital Policy Institute 2010 Conference. The paper selected best overall will also receive a \$200 cash prize.
