History

Aid to Community Service is a non-affiliated, non-profit organization that provides immediate or emergency aid to families or individuals who are unable to receive help from other agencies. One of the activities of Aid to Community Service is working with the Delaware County Probation Department to place delinquent boys and girls in private and church sponsored schools or institutions. The ACS also contributes food, clothing, and money to the Food and Clothing Center; helps provide medical help for those who cannot afford it and cannot receive help in any other way; and offers financial aid for further training or schooling to mothers receiving Aid to Dependent Children.

Scope and Content

This collection contains documents related to Aid to Community Service activities, including Food Pantry Procedure Agreements, Rosters, Minutes and Correspondence, the Constitution and By-Laws, and information about the Food Stamp Program.
