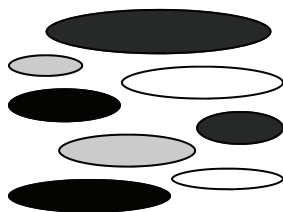

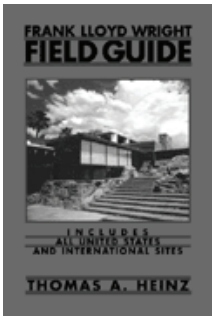
sources Center is interested in your donated images.

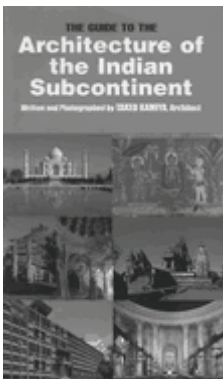

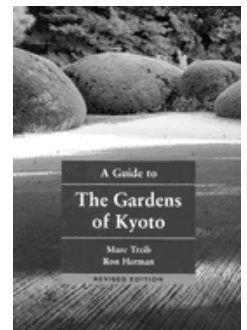

### Reserves

The popularity of electronic reserves continues to grow. Remember to get your requests in 3-7 days before you plan to assign the reading to insure that it will be available to students in time. You're welcome to submit the electronic reserve as a PDF, otherwise library staff will scan the text for you. Copyright restrictions and University Libraries guidelines limit each electronic reserve item to one article from an issue of a journal and one chapter or 10% of a book.
