## CumInCAD Available

CumInCAD (Cumulative Index of Computer Aided Design) is now available to the Ball State Community. The more than 8000 index entries, including 5400 with full text in PDF, include papers in journals and conference papers from ACADIA, CAADRIA, eCAADe, SiGraDi, CAAD

futures, DDSS, and others. Records for all papers include abstracts. A separate index contains 1000 Spanish-language papers.

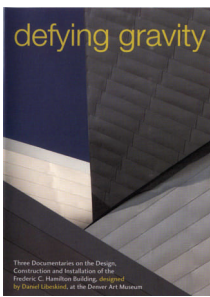

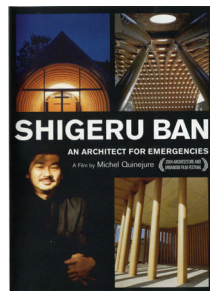

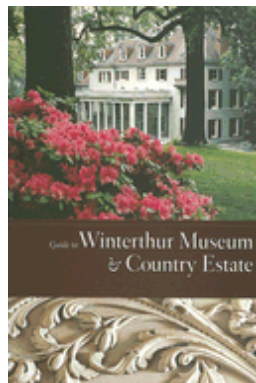
