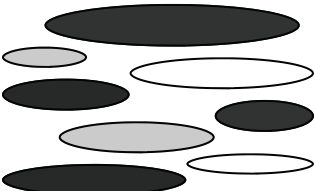

Many Online Resources Available Off-Campus

Even if you are traveling away from campus this summer you won't be far from the University Libraries' online resources. With few exceptions, the library's subscription databases are available to faculty and students who access these resources via the library web pages and login when prompted with their BSU usernames and passwords.

To find similar images in the collection search for study trip keywords such as "PolyArk" or "CapAsia" and Indiana or other place names in the "Location" field.

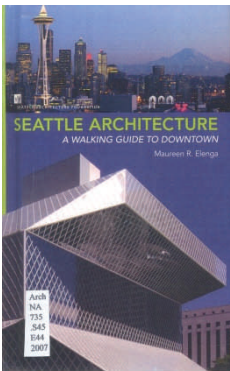

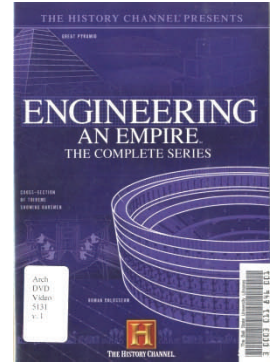

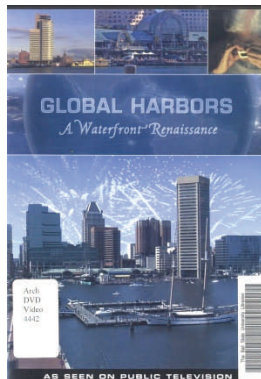
