

WATCHING THE MYVisit on March 18, 2008 at 10:30 a.m. EDT

There are three ways to watch our programs: via satellite, on local cable or PBS, and through an Internet live feed.

1. Satellite:

Ku-Band AMC 03 DIG, Transponder 18-Ch 807, Orbital Slot 87° W, Bandwidth 9 MHz, Downlink Frequency 12064 (V)— a 30-minute test period precedes the broadcast

2. Cable or PBS through your local broadcasting system:

Another great choice is local cable or PBS. We suggest that you call your local cable company or PBS station NOW and request that they carry the show. Most cable companies have educational access channels set aside for this purpose. They will need the satellite coordinates listed above.

3. Internet Feed via Apple Learning Interchange:

If you are not able to receive the broadcast via satellite, local cable or PBS, then watching the show on the Internet is the option for you. **IT IS VERY IMPORTANT THAT YOU CHECK YOUR CONNECTION IN ADVANCE!** Don't wait until the day of the show.

By 10:00 EDT on show day, there will be a link on our main MYVisit website that says "View Broadcast." Click on that and you will be taken to the (Internet) viewing site. **This link won't be up there now—so don't look for it until show day.**

A few days prior to the show, we will send information on how to check your connection.

You will need a projector to show the image to your class on a screen or television. That equipment is based upon your needs at school, so unfortunately we can't help with that. Please don't put your students on several computers in one room, all watching the show. It may cause your system to crash! If you are not sure how to hook up your equipment, you may want to have an IT person or school media specialist show you how. Don't wait until show day! If you are still uncertain, have him or her available a few minutes before the show in case you need help.
