**Certification Course Descriptions**

## PEP 216 Lifeguard Training

This course provides training certification in the American Red Cross course. Training includes Water rescue skills, CPR for the Professional Rescuer, First Aid, Automated External Defibrillation, Oxygen Administration and BBP/PDT. You must pass prerequisites and have the book read prior to the first class. Certification does not guarantee future performance.

## PEP 220 Basic SCUBA

This is a IANTD course and provides a level of understanding to participate in skin and SCUBA diving activities. Must pass a prerequisite skill test and pay special lab fee. Certification does not guarantee future performance.

## PEP 250 First Aid / CPR & PEP 301 Instr.

These are ARC courses. It provides basic level instruction for certification. Future performance not guaranteed. PEP 301 is the American Red Cross CPR Instructor course.

## PEP 315 WSI : Water Safety Instructor

This is an American Red Cross course providing instruction for teaching swimming and water safety programs.. A prerequisite written and skill test is required. Read your texts prior to first class.

## PEP 404 LGI / Lifeguard Instructor

This is an American Red Cross course and trains instructors how to teach Rescue skills, for water and land including CPR, First Aid, Automated External Defibrillation (AED) Oxygen Administration, Lifeguard Management and Preventing Disease Transmission. Prerequisites skills and written required.

## PEP 454 Pool Ops. (CPO & P.O.O.L.)

This is a Pool Operator course. Prerequisites / Age. Please read the text prior to the first class, this is an intense course covering all operational areas including: Filtration, Sanitation, Formulas, and General knowledge required to operate a pool safely and effectively.
