# Cards grab first two wins of 2004

Ball State gets two conference wins, falls to No. 7 Michigan

The field hockey team came into the weekend hungry for its first win. The solid play by the Cardinals earned them a pair of conference victories, beating Louisville on Friday and knocking off Miami on Saturday before losing to No. 7 Michigan on Sunday.

Ball State (2-7, 2-0 Mid-American Conference) finally broke through with its first win of the season, coming at the expense of Louisville (3-6). BSU scored two first half goals and held on for a 2-1 win.

Coach Annette Payne was relieved to finally see her team pull through and get a big win.

"It was huge," Payne said. "The girls worked hard for this."

Lindsay Quay started the scoring for the Cards 10 minutes into the game on an assist from Chantelle Isaac. Holly Frantz added to the cause five minutes later by scoring her second goal of the year, which was also assisted by Isaac.

Frantz expressed similar sentiments as Payne about the first win of the season.

"I think it was huge," Frantz said. "We've been working hard all season. It feels good, especially in MAC."

Gunning for their second win in a row, the Cardinals hosted Miami Saturday. After a sluggish first half and the RedHawks leading 1-0, Ball State came out fired up in the second half. The Cards scored four goals on their way to a 4-1 win.

"We were a little flat in the first half," Payne said. "In the second, we came out a little more Ball State style."

"That's our team."

Quay started the scoring again for the Cardinals, knocking in an unassisted goal seven minutes into the second half. Exactly one minute later, Isaac knocked in her first goal of the season on an assist from Frantz. Isaac would later score again, giving her two for the game.

Freshman Theran Teach scored her first career goal and the third goal of the game for BSU. Teach and Frantz were able to break away and forced the goalie to leave the net. Frantz passed the ball to Teach who put it home for her first collegiate goal.

"It was spectacular," Teach said. "It was a great pass by Holly. I was just there at the right time."

The four goals allowed by Miami came against the top goalkeeper in the MAC entering play. Kerri Orr entered the game with three shutouts and a 1.65 goals-against average.

"Scoring (twice) against the top goalie is definitely a highlight for me," Isaac said.

Although goalkeeper Tracy Bannister did not record a single save, she was able to improve her record to 2-3 on the year.

No. 7 Michigan came to Muncie on Sunday riding a three game winning streak that featured victories over No. 8 Northeastern and No. 16 Indiana. The Wolverines were relentless in their attack and knocked off the Cardinals 4-0.

Michigan (7-3) was led by senior Jessica Blake who scored two goals and assisted the other two. Blake's two goals gives her a season total

of 14, as she has scored in every game but one.

"Michigan is a good team," Payne said. "They are skilled, but our team is too. I think we played great. We have a lot to be proud of. We played well, especially being our third game of the weekend."

"Fatigue may have been a factor."

Despite the loss to Michigan, Ball State sits atop the MAC with a 2-0 record.

"It's good, but there are a lot more games to come," Payne said. "We definitely need to continue to work hard."

# Gym renamed after Ball State alumnus

NBA star reminisces about time spent at community center

The gymnasium in the Roy C. Buley Community Center has a new name and some new decorations on the wall. The gym was dedicated to former Ball State player and Muncie native Bonzi Wells in a short ceremony Friday evening.

As Wells took the stage after being introduced by Micah Maxwell, the executive director of the center, Wells spoke about his time at the center, and began to tear up.

"That's the first time I've cried in years, probably," he said.

Wells has a personal connection to the gym, it was the place that gave him his start.

"I was maybe 10 or 11," he said. "I was on the sidelines, I was kind of like a cheerleader. I just remember the day when my uncle Robert, he was a captain, he had the first pick, and he's like 'I got my nephew.' I thought he was kidding, but he really picked me. And I played as hard as I can."

"I can remember that day like it was yesterday and that was the day and that was the day that really made me want to be one of the best."

The dedication came after Wells donated money to help

keep the gym open. Wells was not the only one to donate, and he requested that he be treated in the same way as the others.

"I wasn't doing it to get nothing like this, I was doing it for the children," Wells said. "When I heard that they were going to close down the community center, I mean, my uncle Robert, he's a director down here and I heard about it, and I told him I wanted to do whatever I possibly can to keep this place open."

"I don't care what it takes, I'm gonna do it because this got my foot in the door, this is what got me started. I know some more Bonzi Wells(es) come in here down the line and they're gonna be better than me and I know the community center will give them a chance."

Now the gym where Wells got his start will carry his name, a plaque with his face and four replica jerseys from Wells various teams.

"What a meaningful way to not only thank Bonzi for his support, but to recognize the important role the center plays in the life of people," Maxwell said.

Wells was obviously thrilled with the dedication, and now whenever he returns to Muncie, he can shoot hoops at the Bonzi Wells gymnasium.

"This is a blessing, this is definitely a blessing," Wells said. "I didn't expect this. They just told me a couple of days ago, and it kind of surprised me. This is unbelievable."

# Team finishes fourth at Eastern Kentucky

The three rounds that the women's golf team played at Eastern Kentucky this weekend were arguably the high point in the Katherine Mowat coaching tenure thus far. Ball State finished fourth in the 11-team meet in Richmond, Ky.

Pacing the way for BSU was Katie Sundberg, who shot a 79-79-75-233 to tie for 10th place,

eight strokes behind Kentucky's Erin Faulkner, the top finisher. Also helping out the Cards' cause was Chelsea Flannery (80-75-83-238), who had a solid second round to aid her score. Julie Harder shot a 77-82-82-241 and managed to tie for 26th place.

Amber Uphaus (79-78-85-242) finished in a tie for 28th. Rounding out the team score was Carmen Bodine (84-81-78-

243), who finished 33rd. Playing individually was Holly Jones, who shot a 81-86-87-254.

As a team, Ball State (315-313-318-946) finished fourth behind the junior varsity team of the University of Kentucky. The Cardinals team score fell 30 strokes behind the Wildcats. Also finishing ahead of BSU were host Eastern Kentucky and MAC rival Ohio. Ball State finished 16 strokes behind ECU

and 14 away from the Bobcats of Ohio.

The high place this weekend should give some momentum to BSU heading into its final meet of the fall schedule. After taking of 13th at Notre Dame and fifth (out of 17) at the Cardinal Classic, Mowat's squad put their most consistent score of the season. Ball State's final meet this fall will be October 8-10 at Florida International.
