**Admissions Requirements**

If you have a Bachelor's in any field, 2.75 minimum undergraduate GPA or 3.0 in the latter half, apply for admissions at [www.bsu.edu/gradschool/admissions/](http://www.bsu.edu/gradschool/admissions/) by submitting an application, a one-time \$35 admission fee, and all undergraduate transcripts.

**Cost**

Tuition rates are subject to change, but in Spring 2008, in-state (Indiana) graduate online tuition is \$235/credit (\$705 for a 3-credit course), and out-of-state is \$404 (\$1212). For Summer 2008 through Spring 2009, the tuition rate is \$246/credit (\$738/course) in-state, and \$428/credit (\$1284/course) out-of-state.
