ART: HISTORY (AHS)

New:

AHS 480. Art History Senior Thesis. (3.0) Synthesis and culmination of the undergraduate art history curriculum. Capstone experience will be an academic paper or curated exhibition (actual or virtual) which demonstrates the student's research, analytical, and writing abilities. Prerequisite: AHS 101, 102; completion of 15 hours of art history; sponsorship by an art history faculty member; permission of the department chairperson. Open only to art history majors.

DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

ENGLISH (ENG)

New:

ENG 615. Workshop in Screenwriting. (3.0) Instruction, practice, and criticism in screenwriting in a workshop format. Prerequisite: permission of the department chairperson. A total of 9 hours of credit may be earned, but no more than 3 in any one semester or term.

DEPARTMENT OF GEOGRAPHY

GEOGRAPHY (GEOG)

Revised:

GEOG 435. Satellite, Radar, and Forecasting. (3.0) Study of the tools used to remotely sense and analyze the atmosphere, including meteorological satellites, Doppler radar, and forecast computer models. Emphasis is on the applications of satellite, radar, and computer model products to short and medium range weather forecasting. Includes an overview of forecast techniques and a forecasting practicum. Prerequisite: GEOG 330.

DEPARTMENT OF GEOLOGICAL SCIENCES

GEOLOGY (GEOL)

New:

GEOL 485. Group Field Research Experience. (3.0 TO 6.0) Mentored, intensive, independent and/or collaborative research experience in a group setting, at an off-campus location. Prerequisite: permission of the department chairperson. A total of 12 hours of credit may be earned, but no more than 6 in any one semester or term. Not open to students who have credit in GEOL 585 same topic.

GEOL 499X. Experimental Elective Course. (1.0 TO 6.0) Experimental new specialty course in the geological sciences. Topic and mode of instruction vary by semester of offering. A total of 9 hours of credit may be earned, but no more than 6 in any one semester or term. Not open to students who have credit in GEOL 599X same topic. Open only to students with at least junior status.

GEOL 585. Group Field Research Experience. (3.0 TO 6.0) Mentored, intensive, independent and/or collaborative research experience in a group setting, at an off-campus location. Prerequisite: permission of the department chairperson. A total of 12 hours of credit may be earned, but no more than 6 in any one semester or term. Not open to students who have credit in GEOL 485 same topic.

GEOL 599X. Experimental Elective Course. (1.0 TO 6.0) Experimental new specialty course in the geological sciences. Topic and mode of instruction vary by semester of offering. A total of 9 hours of credit may be earned, but no more than 6 in any one semester or term. Not open to students who have credit in GEOL 499X same topic. Open only to students with at least junior status.

DEPARTMENT OF MODERN LANGUAGES AND CLASSICS

FRENCH (FR)

New:

FR 470. French Immersive Study Abroad. (1.0 TO 3.0) Immersive capstone study of advanced French language, literature, and culture in a foreign country where French is the native language. Prerequisite: permission of the department chairperson. A total of 3 hours of credit may be earned.

GERMAN (GER)

New:

GER 470. German Immersive Study Abroad. (1.0 TO 3.0) Immersive capstone study of advanced German language, literature, and culture in a foreign country where German is the native language. Prerequisite: permission of the department chairperson. A total of 3 hours of credit may be earned.

JAPANESE (JAPAN)

New:

JAPAN 470. Japanese Immersive Study Abroad. (1.0 TO 3.0) Immersive capstone study of advanced Japanese language, literature, and culture in a foreign country where Japanese is the native language. Prerequisite: permission of the department chairperson. A total of 3 hours of credit may be earned.

PSYCHOLOGICAL SCIENCE (PSYSC)

PSYSC 619. Psychology of Language. (3.0)

PSYSC 641. Psychodiagnostic Aspects of Intellectual Dysfunction. (3.0)

Revised:

PSYSC 575. Advanced Industrial Psychology. (3.0) Principles of personnel testing as applied to the selection and placement process. Focuses on the development of predictors and criteria, selection of an appropriate validation model, and the psychological dynamics of interview processes. Prerequisite: PSYSC 373 or 573, or permission of the department chairperson.

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY

SOCIOLOGY (SOC)

Revised:

SOC 699. Seminar in Selected Topics in Sociology. (3.0) Explores selected topics relevant to the discipline of sociology providing a critical evaluation from a variety of perspectives. May be repeated for different topics. A total of 18 hours of credit may be earned, but no more than 3 in any one semester or term.

DEPARTMENT OF SPECIAL EDUCATION

SPECIAL EDUCATION (SPCED)

New:

SPCED 362. Advanced Practicum Severe Disabilities. (3.0) An advanced practicum emphasizing the application of assessment and teaching methodologies for students with moderate to severe disabilities in classroom and related settings. Projects associated with SPCED 378 will be completed. May be repeated only one time. Prerequisite: SPCED 201, 202, 266, 377 with grades of *C* or better; admission to the teacher education program; passing scores on the PPST; 2.5 overall GPA; permission of the department chairperson. Parallel: SPCED 378. Open only to students majoring in exceptional needs: severe interventions.

SPCED 363. Advanced Practicum Physical Impairments. (3.0) An advanced practicum emphasizing the application of assessment and teaching methodologies for students with physical, sensory, health impairments, and multiple disabilities in classroom and related settings. Projects associated with SPCED 379 will be completed. May be repeated only one time. Prerequisite: SPCED 201, 202, 266, 366 with grades of *C* or better; admission to teacher education program; passing scores on the PPST; 2.5 overall GPA; permission of the department chairperson. Open only to students majoring in exceptional needs: severe interventions.

Revised:

SPCED 361. Advanced Practicum in Special Education. (1.0 TO 9.0) An advanced practicum emphasizing the application of teaching methodologies. Projects associated with specialty methods courses (SPCED 376 or 454 or 476) will be

completed. May be repeated only one time. Prerequisite: SPCED 201 or 302 with grades of *C* or better; SPCED 202, 266, with grades of *C* or better (waived for secondary content area program and dual majors); admission to teacher education program; passing scores on the PPST; 2.5 overall grade-point average; permission of the department chairperson. Parallel: SPCED 366, 376, 378, 454, or 476. A total of 9 hours of credit may be earned.

SPCED 375. Assessment in Special Education. (3.0) Educational assessment practices with students with exceptional needs emphasizing curriculum-based assessment and informal tests. Role of the special educator on the evaluation team of qualified professionals. May be repeated only one time. Prerequisite: grades of *C* or better in SPCED 202, 371, EDPSY 345; admission to the teacher education program; passing scores on the PPST; 2.5 overall grade-point average; permission of the department chairperson.
