Changer is Coming: Land, History and Identity Among the Lower Elwha Klallam Tribe of the North Olympic Peninsula.

ABSTRACT: The Lower Elwha Klallam Tribe of the north Olympic Peninsula in Washington State is one of several governmental partners involved in the removal of two hydroelectric dams from the Elwha River. This study, through the analysis of historical and cultural antecedents, leading to the construction of the dams and the tribe's subsequent involvement with environmental remediation, considers how place, history and colonizing processes have articulated with this Coast Salish community to inform contemporary ideas about cultural survival, resiliency and nation-building.
