# About our Program

# M.Arch Program

The award winning M.Arch program at the R. Wayne Estopinal College of Architecture and Planning aims to develop critical thinking, spatial problem solving, digital literacy, and the lifelong cultivation of design skills.

Our program offers two paths to graduation. The first option is open to students with any undergraduate degree. The 3+ year track requires seven semesters for completion. The second option is open to students with an pre-professional bachelor's degree in architecture. The Advanced Standing track allows students with appropriate experience to bypass the first year of the 3+ year track and begin in the second year of the program.

This degree program is intended for students who hope to pursue a license in architecture.

# Accreditation

The National Architectural Accrediting Board (NAAB), which is the sole agency authorized to accredit U.S.



professional degree programs in architecture, recognizes three types of degrees: the Bachelor of Architecture, the Master of Architecture, and the Doctor of Architecture. Most state registration boards require a degree from an accredited professional degree program as a prerequisite for licensure.

The Department of Architecture offers two paths toward earning a fully accredited Master of Architecture:

M.Arch (3+ years), 99 credit-hours: open to students with a undergraduate degree in any discipline.

M.Arch with Advanced Standing, 60 credit-hours: open to students with a pre-professional degree in architecture.
