***Notes:** The University Core Curriculum (UCC) has three tiers. UCC courses may have prerequisites and/or restrictions to specific majors/minors. For course descriptions and requirements consult the online BSU Catalog (www.bsu.edu/catalog). Each course is identified with its credit hours and courses vary from 2 - 5 credit hours. A student must take as many credits as needed to total 120 semester credits to graduate. The Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree program is also available and requires two years (or the equivalent) of study in one foreign language, normally courses through the 202 level. A student preparing to student teach at the all-grade level is required to spend a minimum of ten weeks in student teaching.
