Foreword

This plan provides an overview of the Department of Architecture's efforts to move toward sustainability in its operations and its interactions with those impacted by its academic, research, and outreach offerings. An attempt to benchmark the current status of sustainability-related accomplishments is presented along with key objectives to be considered for implementation in coming years.

Benchmarking Sustainability Initiatives

The following information was developed from faculty responses to a short-form questionnaire (executed in Fall 2007) dealing with sustainability in Governance and Administration, Operations, Curriculum and Research, and Community Service and Outreach. The Department is pleased to report notable achievements in these areas along with identified opportunities for further development toward more sustainable operations and educational impacts.

A List of Academic Offerings

Topical Sustainability Lectures

A number of public lectures in the Emmens series presented in the College during Fall 2007 dealt with sustainability-related topics. These lectures were well attended by Architecture faculty and students. Several Architecture faculty are presenting in the upcoming Focus the Nation Program. It is harder to indicate the extent to which lectures on sustainability are incorporated into the daily course routine within the Department.
