Bicycle/Pedestrian Resolution Adopted December 6, 2010

Whereas Ball State University seeks to provide leadership in environmental matters through numerous greening of the campus initiatives: and

Whereas the Ball State University Council on the Environment membership represents the university and surrounding Muncie community; and

Whereas in its role the Council is charged to recommend policies for the good of these communities; and

Whereas establishing a bicycle/pedestrian friendly community at Ball State University and in the City of Muncie would provide opportunities for safe and accessible transportation routes that connect the university and the city; and

Whereas such routes would benefit community/university relationships, reduce carbon emissions, encourage business opportunities, and support healthful physical activities;

Now, therefore be it resolved that the Council adopt the following motion:

- That Ball State University devise and implement a plan to increase and enhance infrastructure which promotes bicycling on the campus, including the installation of bicycle paths, routes, parking, and storage facilities.
- That Ball State University engage with the surrounding community (city government, neighborhood associations, businesses, healthcare facilities) to establish bicycle/pedestrian routes connecting campus to established bicycle trails, retail shopping centers, downtown Muncie and outlying areas.
- That Ball State University promote bicycle/pedestrian activity on these routes through educational campaigns directed at students, faculty, and the community.
- That Ball State University assist in the development of low cost bicycle boulevards in its surrounding neighborhoods.
