## Net Zero Energy Performance Adopted October 15, 2018

Whereas Ball State University has achieved international recognition for its commitment to sustainability, and;

Whereas Ball State University can only maintain such recognition for sustainability leadership by adopting leading edge administrative, operational and educational practices, and;

Whereas Ball State University is funding numerous new campus facilities to replace and/or augment the current building stock, and;

**Whereas** Ball State University has established business-as-usual use of the LEED Certification scoring system to enhance the quality of past projects, and:

Whereas, the design of the new Health Professions Building has successfully moved beyond LEED to seek Net Zero Energy performance as a result of a Council on the Environment (COTE) resolution, and;

Whereas the university needs to extend its efforts at achieving exemplary illustration of sustainability in its built fabric;

Whereas, the related (added) capital expense is recoverable in operational and maintenance savings over time:

**Now, therefore be it resolved** that Net Zero Energy performance be considered and aggressively pursued as the new campus-wide standard for all current and future campus projects.
