Estopinal College of Architecture and Planning's Distinctions

- Construction Management student teams are consistently recognized in national and regional competitions against other universities, and graduates have had **100-percent job placement for more than a decade**.
- Since 2020, the Department of Urban Planning has **worked with communities across Indiana** to solve real-world problems through studio class projects, for which students produce comprehensive plans that benefit communities and inform effective investment.
- Teams of Architecture and Urban Planning **students have designed community-responsive proposals** for energy-efficient urban infill-housing in the Old West End neighborhood of Muncie, Ind., continuing the college's commitment to community-engaged, high-performance, and environmentally responsive design and build work.
- The University Design Center provides Interior Design students **practical real-world experiences** through work—including space assessments, design research, and evaluative reports for implementation—with community partner clients.
- Landscape Architecture's professional degree offerings consistently ranks high in national surveys of "**Most Admired**" programs. Also, the department offers a one-year Master of Urban Design program at Ball State ECAP: Indy, where students are provided hands-on experience in urban areas while working with design professionals throughout the Indianapolis area.
- Two teams of historic preservation students received **first place and honorable mention awards for the 2024 Charles E. Peterson Prize**, an award sponsored by the National Park Service.
- In the 2024-25 academic year, students and faculty from the departments of Architecture, Construction Management & Interior Design, Landscape Architecture, and Urban Planning completed **25 community projects across Indiana**.
