Greek Peer Advocates Training Program



Goals & Learning Outcomes:

- Participants will understand the basics of sexual assault prevention and bystander intervention as it relates to the Greek community.
- Participants will engage in dialogue with interfraternal brothers and sisters about the impact sexual assault prevention can have on Greek organizations.
- Participants will be able to provide contact information or resources on campus to members of the Greek community.
- Participants will learn how to create safe environments for their chapter members.
- Participants will implement an action plan for information to be shared with their chapter members in the upcoming semester.

Expectations of Greek Peer Advocate

- Attendance at the seven, one hour training sessions is required.
- Serves as a consultant to Greek community and chapters in education, awareness, and advocacy for sexual assault prevention.
- Provides resources and educational information to group members.
- Completion of self-reflective journals and action plan for implementation week-to-week.
- Maintains privacy and respects individuals.
- Be aware of University procedures.

Timeline & Schedule

- Recruitment for the next semester will take place during the previous semester and first two weeks of the current semester.
- Training Sessions are tentatively Wednesday at 7:00 p.m.
- A date will be set each semester to review action plan and implementation.
- Chapter expectations are as follows:
 - Chapters with 40+ members must complete **two** trainings as a chapter each semester (a total of **four** for the academic year).
 - Chapters with 39 or less members must complete <u>one</u> trainings as a chapter each semester (a total of <u>two</u> for the academic year).
 - o Chapters can self-select the topics for each training or ask the advice of a GPA. Ideally, over the course of 2-3 years each chapter will have completed all of the trainings.
