Spring 2022 Fraternity & Sorority Life Report Executive Summary

Academics

- The spring 2022 All-Greek GPA of 3.127 surpassed the All-BSU average of 3.088.
- The following chapters achieved the highest GPA for their respective council: Phi Kappa Psi (Interfraternity Council), Zeta Phi Beta (National Pan-Hellenic Council), and Chi Omega (Panhellenic Association).

Housing

- Members of Delta Tau Delta, Phi Gamma Delta, Phi Sigma Kappa, Sigma Alpha Epsilon, Sigma Chi, Sigma Nu and Sigma Phi Epsilon live in houses privately owned or leased by their respective housing corporations.
- Alpha Tau Omega, Phi Gamma Delta, Sigma Nu and Sigma Phi Epsilon are alcohol-free facilities.

Leadership Development

- More than 30 FSL leaders participated in the Beneficence Leadership Conference in January, with multiple students presenting at the conference.
- Panhellenic Association hosted a leadership development lecture in February featuring Ball State faculty member, Dr. Barbara Stedman, that was attended by more than 300 community members.
- During Sexual Assault Awareness Month, Fraternity and Sorority Life collaborated with Victim Services, the Counseling Center, Student Government Association and all three Greek Councils to host programming for the entire month of April, including a Take Back the Night event at the end of the month.
- Through a partnership with Phired Up, all three councils were offered unique leadership development opportunities, including individualized consultations, recruitment best-practice information sessions, and more.

Recruitment, Retention & Expansion

- The Greek community totaled 1,341 members during the spring 2022 semester, down from 1,583 members in spring 2021. Currently 10.45% of Ball State students are members of a fraternity or sorority.
- Six of the seven NPHC fraternities and sororities brought in 35 new members this spring, compared to 44 new members the previous spring.
- Of the 11 Panhellenic sororities, eight chapters welcomed 36 new members this spring. This number is down from the 45 women who joined nine chapters during the spring 2021 semester.
- IFC welcomed 33 new members to eight fraternities this spring, down from the spring 2021 semester with 69 new members.
- Theta Chi Fraternity re-colonized and was invited to join the Interfraternity Council again this spring.

Service & Philanthropy

- During the spring 2022 semester, 4,776.40 hours of hands-on community service hours were completed by fraternity and sorority members. This number is a 274.69% increase from the 1,274.77 hours performed in the spring 2021 semester.
- During the spring 2022 semester, \$71,217.88* was raised for charities by fraternities and sororities. This is a 214.65% increase from \$22,634.39 during the spring 2021 semester.
- The Greek community also donated non-perishable items such as canned goods and hygiene products to several local charities.
