

# Fall 2025 Fraternity & Sorority Life Report Executive Summary

## Academics

- The Fall 2025 All-Greek GPA of 3.191 is higher than the All-BSU average of 3.050.
- The following chapters achieved the highest GPA for their respective council: Delta Chi (Interfraternity Council), Alpha Phi Alpha (National Pan-Hellenic Council), and Chi Omega (Panhellenic Association).

## Housing

- Members of Alpha Tau Omega, Delta Tau Delta, Phi Kappa Psi, Sigma Alpha Epsilon, Sigma Chi, Sigma Nu and Sigma Phi Epsilon live in houses privately owned or leased by their respective housing corporations.
- Alpha Tau Omega, Sigma Nu and Sigma Phi Epsilon are alcohol-free facilities.

## Leadership Development

- In November, our governing councils each participated in submitting awards to be recognized by the Association for Fraternal Leadership and Values (AFLV). We will travel to Indianapolis, Indiana in January in hopes of receiving recognition.
- In November, our Interfraternity Council, Panhellenic Association, and National Pan-Hellenic Council held nominations and elections for their new executive board members. These individuals were sworn into their office during our Grand Chapter awards.
- In January, the Panhellenic Association traveled to Plainfield, Indiana to attend the Panhellenic Academy where they will be able to network with other institutions and learn more about their positions.

## Recruitment, Retention & Expansion

- The Greek community totaled 1,228 members during the Fall 2025 semester, up from 1,210 members in Fall 2024. This is a **1.48% increase** of members.
- Currently 8.5% of Ball State students are members of a fraternity or sorority.
- This semester, IFC invited Pi Kappa Alpha (PIKE) to campus where they started their first semester of recruitment.
- The 10 IFC fraternities welcomed 173 new members this Fall. This number is a **2.25% decrease** from the Fall 2024 semester with 177 new members joining all 12 chapters.
- The Interfraternity Council saw one national organization revoke a chapter's charter and another national organization revoke a chapter's colony status which had an effect on our total number of members recruited within the IFC.
- The 10 Panhellenic sororities welcomed 205 new members this Fall. This number is a **22.75% increase** from the Fall 2024 semester with 167 new members joining all 10 chapters.
- The one Cultural Greek Council (CGC) sorority welcomed 8 new members this Fall.

## Service & Philanthropy

- During the Fall 2025 semester, 5,795.34 hours of hands-on community service hours were completed by fraternity and sorority members. This number is a **77.89% increase** from the 3,257.64 hours performed in the Fall 2024 semester.
- During the Fall 2025 semester, \$55,738.38 was raised for charities by fraternities and sororities. This is a **50.47% decrease** from \$112,554.85 during the Fall 2024 semester.
