a skill Eugene S. Pulliam cherished. The award honors Pulliam, publisher of The Indianapolis Star from 1975 to 1999. The award is appropriately named in his honor because he was known as an editor and publisher who valued excellent writing.

Majeri Award for Graphic Journalism

ABOUT THE AWARD

The Majeri Award recognizes innovation and leadership in the profession of graphic journalism. It may be awarded to a publication staff or person for creating a body of work or a singular piece that demonstrates innovation in news design or graphics reporting. This award is named for Anton Majeri Jr., who is now retired but is a former senior editor for design and graphics at the Chicago

Tribune. Under Majeri's leadership the Chicago Tribune won more than 100 awards for design and graphic excellence from the Society for News Design. While aesthetics presentation is important, a nominee's work should emphasize how the visual display of information is driven by editorial content.

The nominee must have excelled in some phase of journalism, public relations or advertising, making that person worthy of the induction into the Hall of Fame.

ABOUT MICHAEL PRICE

Michael Price attended Ball State's J-Day and summer Journalism Workshops before earning a Ball State journalism degree. Soon after, he taught and advised publications at Ball State, where he created its Journalism Graphics program, the nation's first. That program led to The Ball State Daily News' winning the international Society for News Design's "World's Best

Designed™ Newspapers Award" — the only college newspaper ever to be so named. After 10 years at Ball State, Price went on to produce award-winning work at The Philadelphia Inquirer and The San Diego Union-Tribune, where, true to his Ball State roots, he developed an innovative summer journalism institute for high school students of Southern California.
