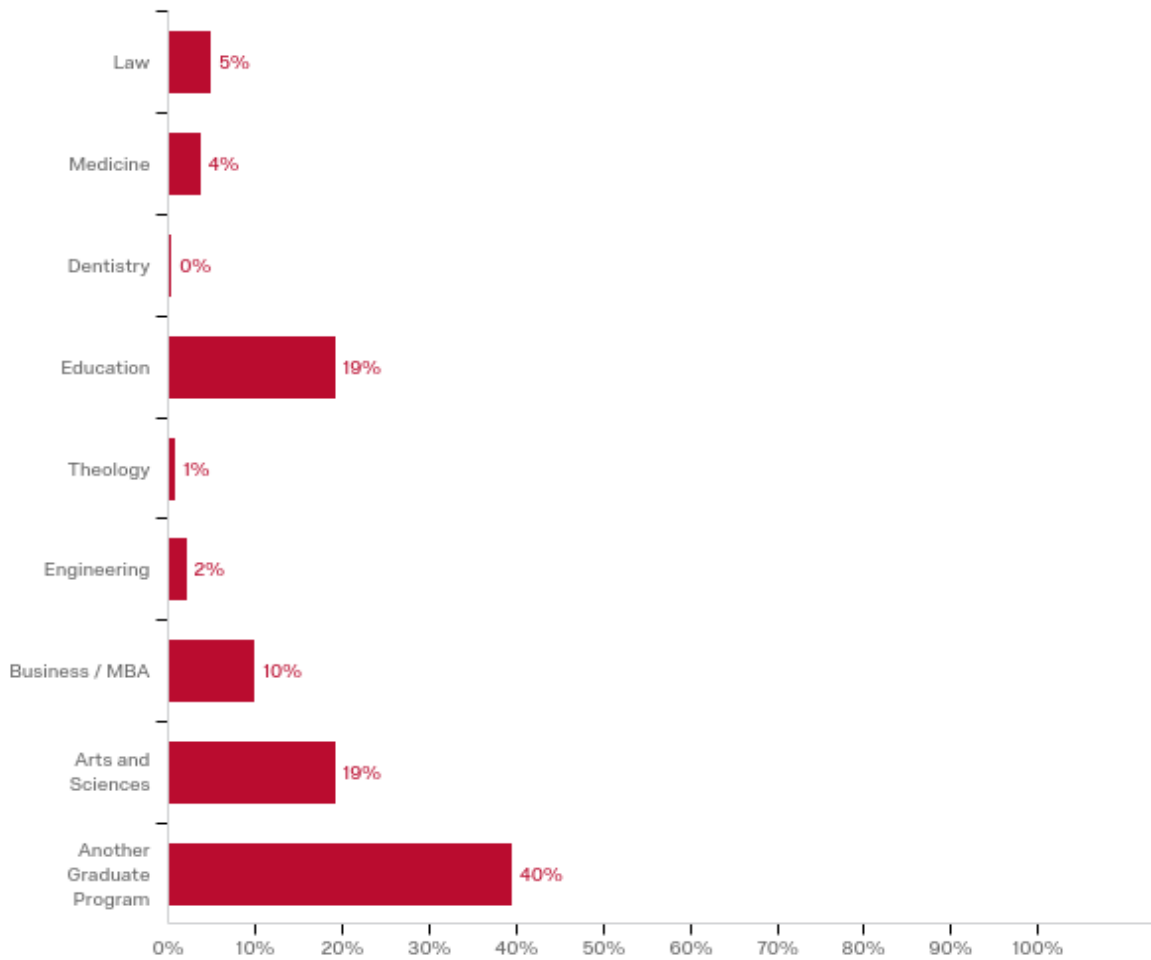


Figure 7. Type of Graduate Program (Among Graduate Enrolled Respondents)

Further Education

- Among all respondents, nearly one-third (30%) reported being enrolled in a graduate program (see Table 7).
- Among the 240 respondents attending some type of graduate program, the largest categories include education (19% of those enrolled in a graduate program), the arts and sciences (19% of those enrolled), and business/MBA (10% of those enrolled) (see Figure 7).
- Forty percent of those enrolled in a graduate program were enrolled in some other type of program (see Figure 7). These programs were specified by respondents and listed in Table 8.
- Nearly 40 percent of alumni (38%) pursuing a graduate degree reported attending Ball State (see Tables 9 and A2 in Appendix).

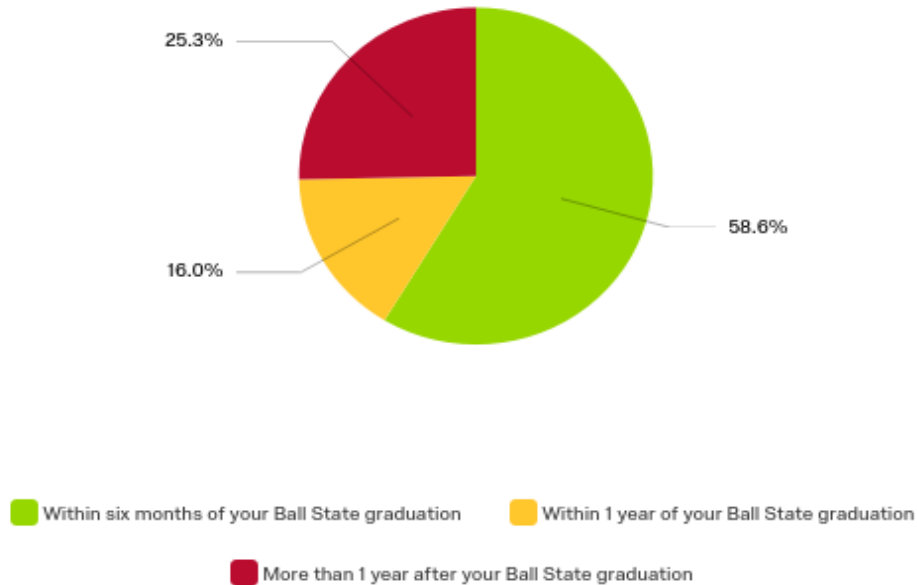

- Nearly six out of ten (59%) currently enrolled respondents attended their graduate programs within six months of their Ball State graduation. Sixteen percent enrolled in a graduate program within one-year of graduating from Ball State, while about a quarter of respondents (25%) enrolled in graduate school over a year after graduation (see Figure 8).
- About 9 out of 10 graduate respondents (93%) reported that Ball State professors in their major field of study prepared them very well (50%) or satisfactorily (43%) for graduate school. Similarly, almost 90% of respondents indicated that academic coursework in their major prepared them very well (38%) or satisfactorily (52%) for graduate school (see Figure 9).
- Over 88% of alumni reported that field experiences while at Ball State, such as internships, immersive learning, and clubs prepared them at least satisfactorily for graduate school. Almost three quarters of graduate respondents (75%) indicated being very well (23%) or satisfactorily (52%) prepared for graduate school as a result of career services provided at Ball State (see Figure 9).
- Approximately one half of respondents indicated that field experiences (54%) and professors in their major (50%) prepared them very well for graduate school. Over 50% of respondents reported being satisfactorily prepared for graduate school from career services (52%) and academic coursework in their major (52%) (see Figure 9).
