Good afternoon, everyone. My name is Geoff Mearns, and I have the good fortune to serve as the president of Ball State University. It's my pleasure to welcome you to today's ceremony.

But because of challenging market conditions in Muncie, our University is also providing financial support to make this residential development a viable project. We feel confident in our investment because we have such great trust in the quality of homes built by Trademark. We are proud to work with this local homebuilder—a homebuilder that, like us, is invested in the long-term future of our community.

I'd now like to invite Terry Robinson to the podium to say a few words of his own.
