Policy: Purchasing from Traditionally Disadvantaged Business

General

As a supplement to the [Ball State University Equal Opportunity and Affirmative Action Policy](#) , the Purchasing Department supports the University's commitment to the promotion of diversity with vendors who supply goods and services to the University by:

- Expanding and increasing awareness of opportunities for Minority, Women and Veteran owned Business Enterprises. (MWBE/V).
- Meeting with representatives of MWBE/Vs to discuss their offerings of products and services.
- Encouraging links between MWBE/V's businesses and the University's end user departments.
- Actively providing MWBE/Vs the opportunity to submit price quotations for the potential procurement of products and services.
- Utilizing a minimum of two (2) MWBE/V suppliers on all Requests for Quotes (RFQ) and Request for Proposals (RFP)
- Focusing on securing business contracts with firms identified as MWBE/Vs, which fulfill a need for Ball State University.

Minority and Women Businesses

Veteran Owned Businesses
