INSTITUTIONAL HISTORY

Ball State University traces its roots to the late 19th century when Muncie business leaders, including the five Ball Brothers, envisioned a local college to boost the city's development. In 1918, the Ball family donated land and buildings to the State of Indiana, leading to the creation of the Indiana State Normal School Eastern Division. The school was renamed several times over the next few years.

By the 1960s, the regional teachers college had begun to attract faculty from outside the Midwest, and students sought majors in disciplines beyond teaching. Enrollment and funding surged with national trends, and new facilities and degree offerings were added. In 1965, the school became Ball State University, acknowledging its phenomenal growth in enrollment and facilities, the variety and quality of its educational programs and services, and the anticipation of the broader role it would play in the state's future.

ABOUT THE DUAL DEGREE PROGRAM


Our Dual Degree program offers three types of models: 1+2+1, 2+2, and 3+1+1. In the first two models, students receive bachelor's degrees from both their home university and BSU upon completing all requirements.

The 3+1+1 model differs slightly, as students earn one undergraduate degree from their home university and one graduate degree from BSU,

CHEPD 1+2+1 PROGRAM

In 2004, Ball State became one of the first American institutions to join the **Sino-American CHEPD 1+2+1 Program**. CHEPD stands for Cooperation in Higher Education and Professional Development. We are a proud partner of the China Center for International Education Exchange (CCIEE) and the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU).

since 2004, BSU established partnerships with 27 institutions, receiving approximately 550 students through the 1+2+1 Program. Many of these students return to Ball State for their master's degrees, and others frequently go on to be accepted into master's and PhD programs at some of the top 50 institutions for higher education in the US.

ENGLISH PROFICIENCY REQUIREMENTS

Students must provide proof of sufficient English proficiency to enroll in academic courses at Ball State. The following test scores are accepted:

Students whose scores do not meet the minimum requirements above can enroll in the **Ball State University Intensive English Institute (IEI)** prior to beginning their degree program. The IEI provides English instruction for all levels of non-native speakers of English who have a secondary school (high school) degree.

IEI Classes are:

- 7 weeks in length
- 20 hours per week
- On campus at Ball State University
- Up to 15 students per class

The IEI has 3 levels, with 6 courses in each level. Courses are classified as Core or Complementary. The Core courses are Writing, Reading, Listening, and Speaking. The Complementary classes are Grammar and Cultural Experiences. All courses rely heavily on students interacting in English.

ARRIVAL & CAMPUS LIFE

AIRPORTS

Ball State is about 70 miles northeast of Indianapolis. The Indianapolis International Airport (IND) is the closest airport to campus. Other airports in the region include Fort Wayne (FWA), Cincinnati (CVG), Dayton (DAY), and Chicago O'Hare (ORD). Please note that Ball State shuttle services only provide transport to and from the Indianapolis International Airport.

BUS SERVICES

Campus Shuttles

Shuttles provide free transportation around campus during the Fall and Spring semesters. Shuttles run Monday through Friday, with limited service available on Sundays. Campus shuttles are free of charge.

Airport Shuttle

Shuttle services to and from the Indianapolis International Airport (IND) can be reserved for \$55 per person on a oneway trip.

Demand Response Bus

Students and employees approved for accommodations through Human Resources may use the Demand Response Bus to take them directly where they need to go on campus.

CAMPUS HOUSING

Ball State offers on-campus housing in one of our eleven residence halls. Most rooms are doubles with air-conditioning. Bathrooms are private, semi-private, or community-style. Rates

depend on room type and range from approximately \$2,400- \$4,500 per semester. Meal plans are required for students living in residence halls; there are many meal plan options with a cost of approximately \$2,500-\$3,500 per semester.

HEALTH INSURANCE

Students and scholars studying on a J visa are required by federal law to carry health insurance that meets certain minimums. Students on F (or other) visas do not have specific insurance requirements but are strongly recommended to carry health insurance as the United States does not have a nationalized health care system.

Ball State University does not offer an international student health insurance plan. Students and scholars can choose their health insurance coverage. Please note that J visa students and scholars will be required to provide proof of adequate and ongoing insurance coverage to International Services.
