



CREDIT HOUR & GRADING CONVERSION FOR

AIFS - Université Grenoble Alpes

These guidelines have been developed based on information provided by the partner institutions and by professional credential evaluation organizations. Any questions about grade or credit equivalency should be addressed to the Study Abroad Office.

CREDIT HOURS

All AIFS students are enrolled at the Centre Universitaire d'Etudes Françaises (CUEF) for language and culture classes. Language level determines which classes they will take. The language class (90-150 hours) appears on the transcript along with 5 grades (written comprehension, written expression, oral comprehension, oral expression and work/effort). The university recommends the 5 grades be averaged together to obtain an overall, single grade for the language class. Language levels correspond with the level attained at the *end* of the course. Students also enroll in Seminars in English or Language Coursework to complement their language study. For individual courses worth more than the approved BSU equivalent, excess credit will be articulated as INSA 400 unless otherwise designated by the academic department(s) on the Request for Study Abroad Credit form. Multiple Grenoble courses may be combined when articulated back to BSU equivalents.

Students must earn the Ball State equivalent of a C or better (10) in order to transfer a course from Grenoble. The Ball State University transcript will reflect grades of CR or NC, which are not calculated into the student's cumulative grade point average.
