- Late or incomplete applications will not be reviewed until all documents are received. Upon initial review, if there are missing documents or other feedback is received, students will have 3 business days (M-F) to return those documents to Professor Evans. If those documents are not received after three business days (M-F), the application will not be reviewed in the current admissions cycle. You will receive an email from Brandon Evans that your file is complete, received and will be reviewed.
- Typically, students are notified of a decision or the need to interview within approximately 15 days after the application deadline. If there are delays, Brandon Evans will notify students as to when admissions decisions are sent out. All admissions decisions will be sent via email to the student's BSU email.

Important Notes: *All BSW students must apply for formal admission to the social work major at BSU. This requirement is consistent for all CSWE-accredited social work programs. Admission to the university does not automatically guarantee full admission to the social work major. Before applying to the social work major, you must have satisfied or be enrolled in required core SOCW courses in the current semester of your application. The core major courses are as follows (SOCW 100, 200, 220, 240, 250). Students may also apply to the major while enrolled in SOCW 310, 320, 340). Additionally, admission to the BSW program and earning a BSW from Ball State does not guarantee admission to the MSW program. The MSW program has a separate and independent admissions process.*

The Admissions Committee can consider your application for conditional admittance or request students submit a waiver discussing their academic record. ***All students who have a 2.8 GPA or below in the major will be required to interview with members of the Admissions Committee. If you are new to BSU at the time of admission, your grades in current social work courses will be reviewed to determine your GPA. If there are other concerns or areas where the committee might need to evaluate your application appropriately, we may request an interview to discuss your application.***

Part Two: Discuss the field(s) of social work that is of the most interest to you. Describe the skills you believe a successful social worker in this field must possess.

Part Three: Demonstrate self-awareness by discussing your strengths and weaknesses as it relates to working with populations at risk, specifically clients of various cultures and backgrounds. Also, if you believe that you will need consistent and ongoing support to meet the academic and professional expectations of the program, please identify those areas of support you may need.

Part Four (At least one type-written page): Identify a social issue facing our society. Briefly describe this problem and discuss how social workers might intervene with the social issue. You should cite at least two sources for this part of the paper and use correct APA citations.

You may complete this below or you may attach a separate Word or PDF document to your application when submitted. Please indicate on your narrative a heading for each section; (i.e. Part One, Part Two, etc) to make it easier for the reader to follow your document. Our goal in this writing

exercise is for you to demonstrate your abilities and also to learn more about your strengths and needed areas of growth.

SOCIAL WORK CODE OF CONDUCT

The Social Work Code of Conduct is designed to promote the growth of ethically responsible students and future professionals by setting standards for academic integrity and overall ethical conduct. The

Importance of Human Relationships: I will engage faculty as partners in my growth and engage clients as partners in the helping process. In working with clients, I will avoid conflicts of interest that would interfere with the exercise of professional discretion and impartial judgment, which includes setting clear, appropriate, and culturally sensitive boundaries.

Integrity: I understand that I am expected to demonstrate personal integrity in meeting the objectives of the social work program and in fulfilling all degree requirements. I will carry out my role as learner honestly, honorably, and responsibly. The academic products I prepare and submit to meet program requirements will be produced through my own efforts and will not involve the use of term paper mills or be the result of any other form of unauthorized aid—nor will I submit in whole or in part the same work for credit in more than one class, except with prior approval of the instructor. I will meet and maintain academic standards of the institution and the department, and I will refrain from academic dishonesty of any sort.

Competence: In order to become a culturally competent practitioner, I will conscientiously participate in educational activities that promote sensitivity to, knowledge about, and appreciation of cultural diversity.
