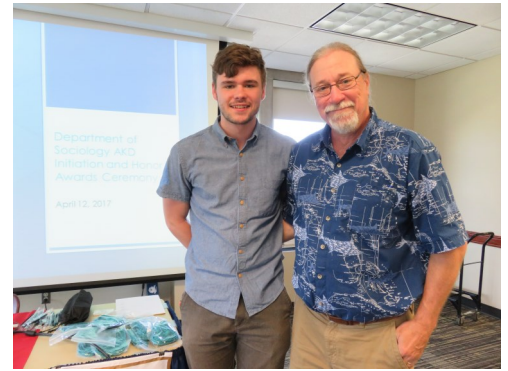
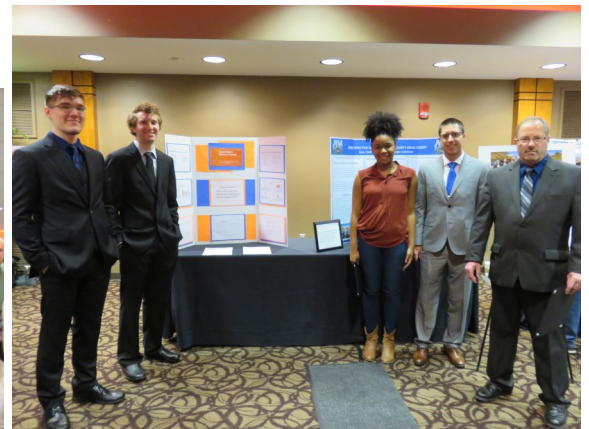

Celebrating The Career of Dr. Deollos

Dr. Ione DeOllos retired at the end of May and will be greatly missed. Below is an excerpt from the Omega Dinner comments. Ione DeOllos earned her PhD in Sociology from Arizona State University 1993. She started at BSU in 1994 and taught classes in Theory, Globalization, Social Movements, Racial and Ethnic Minorities, Family, and Environmental Sociology. Appointed in 2003 by Governor O'Bannon to serve as the faculty representative to the Indiana Commission for Higher Education, she was later selected to serve as Chair of the Statewide Transfer and Articulation Committee (STAC). Dr. D. also served as liaison to other state and national bodies including ACT, the National Institute for the Study of Transfer Students, and the National Alliance of Concurrent Enrollment Partnerships. Dr. DeOllos served on the BSU Institutional Review Board since 2009 most recently serving as the co-chairperson. She has also taken on challenging roles including serving on appeals panels and the Financial and Budgetary Affairs Committee during her time on the Faculty Senate. She has served on the Task Force for the Status of Women since 2010 and has been a vocal proponent for helping break down barriers in Higher Education for decades.

The Department of Sociology is pleased to announce that Dr. Richard Petts received a National Institutes of Health grant for \$87,704 for his project:

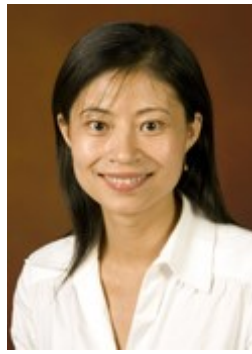

Featured Research: Differences in Perceptions of Everyday Discrimination

Gong, Fang, Jun Xu and David Takeuchi (2017) "Racial and Ethnic Differences in Perceptions of Everyday Discrimination." *Sociology of Race and Ethnicity*.

This study examines differences in perceptions of discrimination across multiple racial and ethnic minority groups. The authors focus on structural factors such as race/ethnicity and socioeconomic status (SES) and psychosocial factors such as racial/ethnic identities as predictors of perceived everyday discrimination. Data come from the Collaborative Psychiatric Epidemiology Surveys (CPES), and analyses reveal several important patterns

Dr. Kapinus, had most recently served as Interim Associate Vice President for Research and Dean of the Graduate School but she had also served as Director of Graduate Studies in the Department of Sociology where she taught numerous courses including graduate methods, Introductory Sociology, Capstone and more. 2017 Sabbatical Presentation

In Spring 2017 Dr. Lisa Pellerin presented her work: "The effect of parent attitudes and caregiving arrangements on children's socio-emotional development."

Using data from the Early Childhood Longitudinal Study - Birth Cohort, Pellerin modeled the effects of parent attitudes and pre-school child care quality, type and extent on a multi-item measure of children's socio-emotional readiness for Kindergarten. Readiness is negatively

affected by parents' being overwhelmed or having "no energy for discipline," and positively affected by parents' being "easy-going and relaxed." Child care type (center, relative, etc.) has no effect, nor do general measures of quality. Caregiver at-



tachment has an unexpected negative effect on children's socio-emotional readiness.

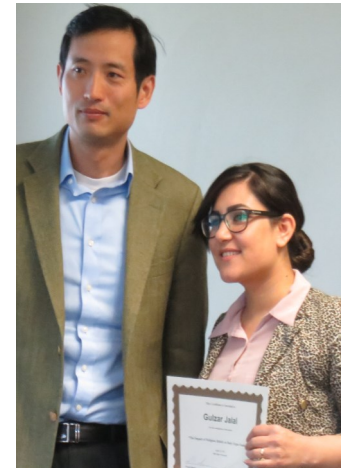
