STATISTICAL SOFTWARE

prvalue.ado: A Stata user-written ado program as part of the SPost package that can be used to produce predictions, differences in predictions and their confidence intervals for a wide array of categorical and limited dependent variable models (with J. Scott Long). It combines several low-level utility ado files, including _pecidelta.ado (for the delta method), _peciboot.ado (for the bootstrapping method), and _peciml.ado (for the end-point transformation method), and _pepred.ado (for producing predictions and their precision estimates).

prgen.ado: A Stata user-written ado program (a wrapper of prvalue.ado) used to graph predictions, differences in predictions, and their confidence intervals for categorical and limited dependent variable models (with J. Scott Long).

grcompare: A Stata package (with 7 ado files) for statistical group comparisons in binary regression models. It can provide a difference between two local predicted probabilities,

difference between two group-averaged predicted probabilities, differences in predicted probabilities over a range, difference in difference in predicted probabilities, difference in local marginal effects, and differences in group-averaged marginal effects.

stdcoef.r: An R function that provides x-standardized, y-standardized, fully-standardized regressions coefficients, and odds ratio coefficients if applicable for commonly used categorical and limited dependent variable models
