1 Begin at **Lucina Hall**.

Lucina Hall is a first-stop spot for many new students seeking undergraduate degrees. Originally constructed as a women's dormitory, it was converted to office space in the 1970s.

2 Take a photo with **Beneficence**.

We like to call her "Benny" for short! Her right hand reaches out welcoming you to Ball State. Her left hand holds a treasure chest signifying the knowledge and treasure you can obtain at Ball State.

3 Stroll through the **Quad**.

This historic part of our campus is the perfect place to relax between classes. Take a lap around this beautiful area and count the number of squirrels you see!

4 Cross the **Scramble Light**.

The intersection of McKinley Avenue and Riverside Avenue is different than most. When you hear chirping, you can cross any direction (even diagonally!) for 30 seconds.

5 Walk through **Bracken Library**.

Bracken Library is your place to find scholarly resources, expert research assistance, and quiet or collaborative study areas. Other amenities include the Technology HelpDesk, free printing services, a café, and a contemplation space.

6 Say hello to **Frog Baby**.

Students used to visit the David Owsley Museum of Art and rub her nose for good luck on exams, but now she plays in a fountain with frogs just outside of Bracken Library. Students routinely dress her up for holidays and events.

7 Check out the **Rec Center**.

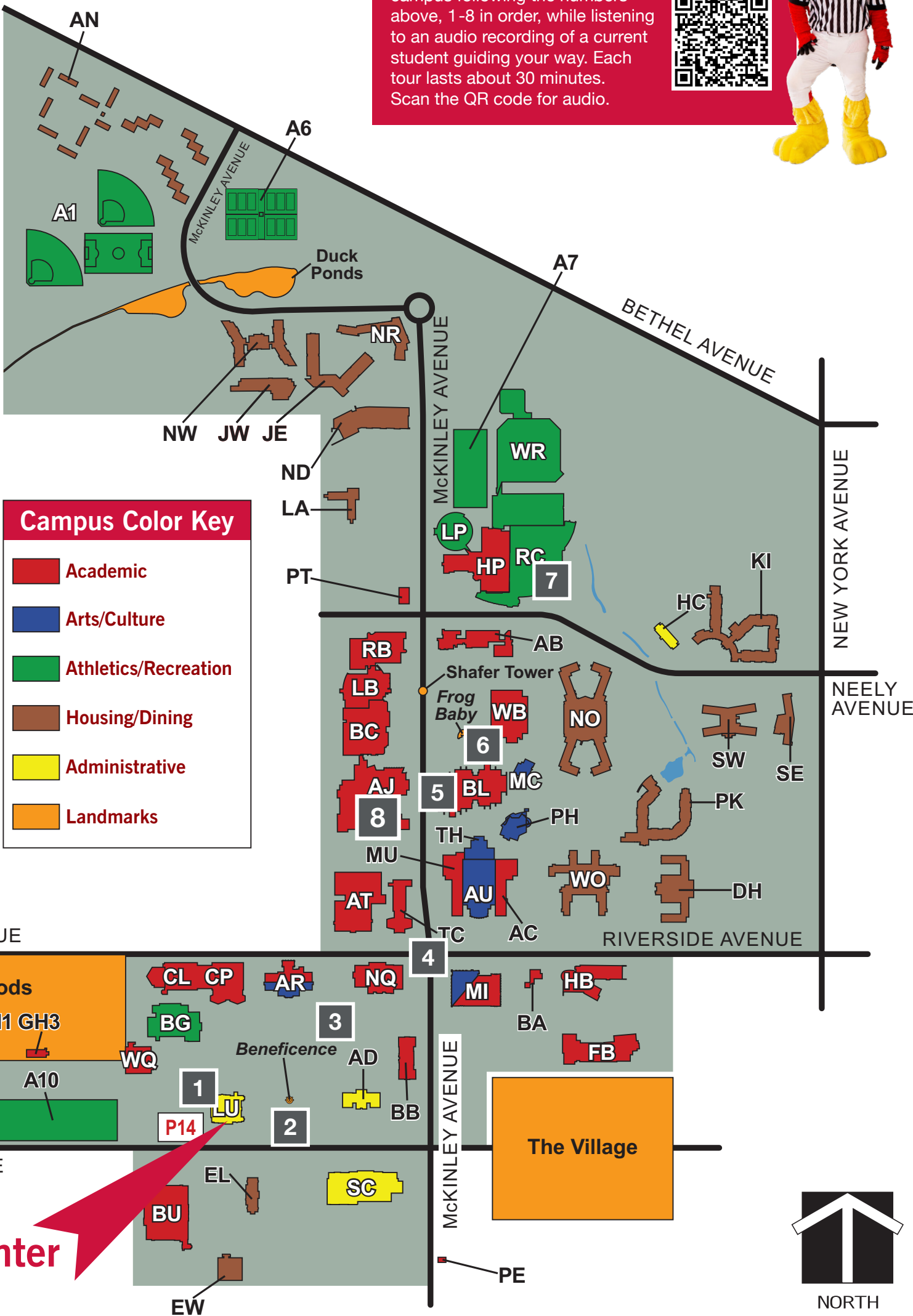

Welcome Center

Applied Technology Building (AT)

Our student-run Allégro restaurant is located here, along with the Robert G. Hunt Center for Construction Management and the Weidner Center for Residential Property Management.

This building is home to majors in Construction Management, Fashion Industry Studies, Hospitality Innovation and Leadership, Interior Design, and Property Management.

Architecture Building (AB)

This facility houses studios, labs, and galleries for one of the nation's largest and most comprehensive schools of environmental design plus the Institute for Digital Intermedia Arts.

This building is home to majors in Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Urban Planning.

Art and Journalism Building (AJ)

Here you'll find the student-run Unified Media Lab as well as the Center for Emerging Media Design and Development, a student art gallery, the Ball State Bookstore, and The Atrium food court.

This building is home to majors in Art, Journalism, and Strategic Communication.

Arts and Communications Building (AC)

Adjacent to Emens Auditorium and University Theatre, this building is home to the Strother and Cave Theatres for more intimate student stage productions.

This building is home to majors in Theatre and Dance.

Ball Communication Building (BC)

Our award-winning Sports Link and Digital Corps student media programs are located here, along with public television station WIPB, one of the nation's largest virtual production studios, and the Center for Information and Communication Sciences.

This building is home to majors in Computer and Information Technology and Media/Telecommunications.

Ball Honors House (BA)

Our distinctive Honors College program for high-ability students thrives in this historic former home of the late Edmund F. Ball, two of Ball State's most generous benefactors.

This building is home to the Honors College.

Burkhardt Building (BB)

Located on the edge of our historic Quad, the second oldest building on campus is home to the Applied Anthropology Laboratories and our women's and gender studies program.

This building is home to majors in Anthropology, History, and Women's and Gender Studies.

Cooper Science Complex (CL/CP)

Standing next to Christy Woods, this building is home to the Charles W. Brown Planetarium—the largest facility of its kind in Indiana—plus the Ball State Weather Station and our student-run Cardinal Weather Service and Storm Chase Team.

This building is home to majors in Astronomy, Geography, Meteorology, and Physics.

David Letterman Communication and Media Building (LB)

Named for our most famous graduate, this building houses one of the nation's largest communications schools and includes top-notch film and television production facilities, student-run radio station WCRD, and Indiana Public Radio.

This building is home to majors in Communication Studies and Media/Telecommunications.

Fine Arts Building (AR)

The David Owsley Museum of Art fills this historic building with about 1,000 works of ancient and modern art on display and a collection totaling more than 11,000 pieces representing cultures around the world.

This building is home to majors in Environmental Geoscience, Geology, and Natural Resources and Environmental Management.

Foundational Sciences Building (FB)

This new state-of-the-art facility features premier labs, advanced microscopy and imaging equipment, an aquatics suite, and collaborative spaces for students to work together on chemistry and biology research.

This building is home to majors in Biology and Chemistry.

Hargreaves Music Building (MU)

Adjacent to Emens Auditorium, this facility includes music classrooms, instructional studios, rehearsal spaces, practice rooms, and a piano lab.

This building is home to majors in Music.

Health and Physical Activity Building (HP)

Adjacent to the Jo Ann Gora Student Recreation and Wellness Center, this is home to our Biomechanics Laboratory, Fisher Institute of Health and Well-Being, and nationally known Human Performance Laboratory.

This building is home to majors in Kinesiology.

Health Professions Building (HB)

Students in health-related majors learn and practice patient care together through real-life and virtual simulations in this innovative facility, which includes cutting-edge labs, the award-winning Healthy Lifestyle Center, and our Interprofessional Community Clinics.

This building is home to majors in Athletic Training, Counseling, Nursing, Nutrition and Health Science, Social Work, and Speech Pathology and Audiology.

Music Instruction Building (MI)

Sura Performance Hall, Hahn Recital Hall, and our Music Media Production Studios are located here, along with music teaching studios and rehearsal spaces.

This building is home to Music majors.

North Quad Building (NQ)

This historic building on the edge of our wooded Quad once housed Ball State's original library and assembly hall. Today it's home to several liberal arts programs, Academic Advising, Student Athlete Support Services, and the Learning Center, which offers free tutoring and academic coaching.

This building is home to majors in Criminal Justice and Criminology, Modern Languages and Classics, Philosophy, Religious Studies, Political Science, Psychological Science, and Sociology.

Robert Bell Building (RB)

This facility includes selected programs in our liberal arts college plus the Writing Center, Information Technology Services, and our new Esports Center for competitive gaming and media production.

This building is home to majors in Computer Science, Data Analytics, English, and Mathematical Sciences.

Teachers College Building (TC)

Standing 10 stories high, the tallest building in Delaware County houses our nationally recognized teacher education programs upon which Ball State was founded more than a century ago. The Center for Autism Spectrum Disorder is also located here.

This building is home to majors in Early Childhood, Educational Leadership, Educational Psychology, Educational Studies, Elementary Education, and Special Education.

Whittinger Business Building (WB)

Our nationally recognized business programs are here, along with our Entrepreneurship Center, Center for Professional Selling, and Center for Business and Economic Research. Other centers support students in logistics and supply chain management and in actuarial science, insurance, and risk management.

This building is home to majors in Accounting, Economics, Entrepreneurship and Innovation, Finance and Insurance, Information Systems, Management, and Marketing.
