70 percent of survey respondents said their education prepared them to analyze data quantitatively. 80 percent said they were well prepared to work collaboratively with others. 80 percent said they were taught to understand issues of equity and social justice. Internship employers last year gave our students an average score of 4.7 on a 5-point scale measuring their overall performance. “— was excellent” and “I’d hire – tomorrow if I had a Planner 1 opening” were among the comments.
