Student Achievement

In a survey, of the graduating class of 2019: two-thirds of students either agreed that their education prepared them to analyze data quantitatively. 100 percent agreed or strongly agreed that they were well prepared to work collaboratively with others. 100 percent said the program provided good preparation for their planning career.

Internship supervisors last year rated our students "above average" or "excellent" in each of a dozen categories and assigned a 7.4 rating out of a possible 8 points.
