<b>Student Achievement</b>	
91 percent of students either agreed or strongly agreed that their education prepared them to analyze data quantitatively. 100 percent agreed or strongly agreed that they were well prepared to work collaboratively with others. 100 percent also agreed or strongly agreed that professors prepared them to understand issues of equity and social justice. Internship supervisors last year rated our students either “above average” or “excellent” in each of a dozen categories. “Performance was outstanding” and “an excellent addition to our office” were among the comments.
