### Student Achievement

In a January 2022 survey of the class of 2020: 100 percent strongly agreed that their education prepared them to work collaboratively with others. The same percentage either strongly agreed or agreed that they were well prepared for their career, that they were prepared to analyze data quantitatively, and that they had been prepared to understand issues of equity and social justice.  
Internship supervisors rated our 2021 MURP interns' performances at a 7.6 on an 8-point scale.
