The Master of Urban and Regional Planning (MURP) degree is open to anyone who holds a bachelor's degree. Urban planning is an interdisciplinary profession. Planners use a wide variety of skills, and students in communications, history, natural resources, political science, business, and sociology and anthropology, to name a few disciplines, succeed in this field. Applicants must meet the admission requirements of the Graduate School and be approved by the Department of Urban Planning. International students must also meet the Ball State International Admission requirements. The curriculum is comprised of a common core of knowledge that is essential to planning and allied electives available in planning and other fields.
