

The Muriel and Irene Goldman Scholarship

Irene Goldman-Price (formerly Irene Goldman) was deeply involved with women's studies and the Women's Studies Program during her years as a faculty member at Ball State University (1986-1997). From 1991-1994, she served as the director of the program (which was renamed the Women's and Gender Studies program in 2009). This scholarship was established by Irene and her father in order to continue Irene's commitment to women's studies students and as a memorial to honor their mother and wife, Muriel Goldman, a talented, generous, and loving woman who believed in education for women as well as for men. Funds to establish the Muriel and Irene Goldman Scholarship were donated by David W. Goldman and Irene C. Goldman-Price.

Award Amount

We may award one or two separate scholarships of \$1,500 each year.

Scholarship Requirements:

Applicant must:

1. Have a declared Women's and Gender Studies major or minor at Ball State University.
2. Be enrolled full-time.
3. Hold sophomore or junior standing.
4. Have at least a 3.0 grade point average.

Preference will be given to those demonstrating financial need; however, other qualified students will also be eligible for the award. Awards will be made without regard to race, sex, gender, religion, color, national origin, physical and mental disability, age, sexual identity, or ancestry.

Application must be received electronically, no later than **5:00 PM EST Friday, April 7, 2023**.
