Course Description/Objectives: This course consists of weekly individualized lessons in applied music performance on the student's primary instrument. Instruction is tailored to the student's current level of development and professional goals, focusing on technical proficiency, stylistic fluency, repertoire, and musicianship. Through guided practice, performance preparation, and critical listening, students will strengthen their technique, expand their repertoire, and develop the artistry and discipline required of a professional musician.

Grades: Grades will be based on attendance, preparation, and overall progress demonstrated in lessons. Consistent attendance and thorough preparation are required to achieve a satisfactory grade.

Attendance: Students are expected to attend all scheduled lessons. At least 24 hours' notice is required to reschedule a lesson. Unexcused absences or failure to provide adequate notice will negatively affect the final grade.

Required Materials: Students are required to bring their instrument to every lesson. Music and supplemental materials will be provided.
