### **I. Course Description**

The course is designed to expose the student to many different styles and genres of jazz composition. Included in the instruction are: tone production, intonation, dynamic flexibility, balance, technical facility and accuracy, phrasing, musical interpretation, style, knowledge of performance practice, and stage presence.

### **II. Course Objectives/Student Learning Objectives**

Students enrolled in the course are expected to improve individually and, as an ensemble member, as significantly as possible in order to achieve both a satisfying performance level within the ensemble and a level of expertise that can be transferred to other ensembles and literature. Students will be able to sight-read, play in tune, phrase and interact with other people on a higher level than when they came in.

### **III. Rationale**

Jazz is the basis for most types of commercial music today. The word “Jazz” encompasses a variety of ever-changing genres of music. The student with a solid background in Jazz will have more success than a classically trained musician especially with sight-reading, rhythms, syncopation AND improvisation.

### **IV. Course Expectations**

Attendance: attendance is required at each rehearsal M-W-F 11AM – 11:50AM and Wed. evening from 6:30 to 8PM. ### **VI. Grading**

In the past I have attempted to use grades to get people to rehearsal on time. If you take the class for a grade, show up when you are supposed to and make improvement you will receive an A. I HAVE A HUGE PROBLEM with tardiness and will not TOLERATE it. You get 3 strikes and then you are **REMOVED** from the ensemble. The 3rd time you are late that is it. If you miss OR are late for a performance without a VALID excuse you will not play. You are in college and will be treated as ADULTS.

### **BSU INSTRUMENTAL ENSEMBLES POLICY: Cell phone usage/texting during rehearsal**

1) Cell phones/smart phones are not permitted at any time during rehearsal. Cell phones/smart phones should be powered down (or silenced) prior to rehearsal and be packed away. They are not to be put on stands or in sight at any time during rehearsal. (The ONLY exception is for use as a tuner. In that case, students are required to put on “airplane mode.”)

3) This policy is in effect immediately. The first infraction will constitute a "verbal warning." Each violation after the first will result in the **student's grade being lowered by one letter grade.**

### **Information Technology – One-Month Laptop Loan Service For Students**

Please advise students to first explore the following options:

Available public computers, such as the Student Center lab, Housing labs, and Library public workstations.

Obtaining [financial aid](#) for purchase of a computer. Applying through this process will only increase eligibility for federal or private loan programs.

Students should explore purchasing a [low-cost entry-level](#) model available at the Technology Store beginning at \$373.

If none of the above options are viable, students meeting the following criteria may **apply** for a one-month loan of a basic laptop. To be eligible, students must:

Be enrolled in the University as a main-campus, degree-seeking student. This includes students whose on-campus classes were moved to online sections.

Be enrolled for at least 12 credit hours as an undergraduate, or 9 credit hours a graduate student.

Be willing to sign (or electronically agree) to replacement or damage costs if the laptop is not returned, or is returned damaged.

Agree that laptops may only be borrowed for one month. Renewal may be possible, based on availability.

Note that students who enrolled in the University as an online-only student are not eligible, as they are required to have access to a computer as part of their enrollment.

Due to the limited availability, the offering of loaners must be by referral to Information Technology from Student Affairs or Academic Affairs. Loaners will be issued on a first come, first serve basis for students meeting the above criteria. Meeting eligibility requirements does not guarantee availability of a laptop under this program.

This offering will only be available to students referred to Information Technology by Student Affairs or Academic Affairs. Information Technology will not publicize this offering generally, due to limited availability of laptops for long-term loan.
